### **Counselors** Corner

"I believe that I cannot by my own reason or strength believe in Jesus Christ, my Lord, or come to Him; but the Holy Spirit has called me by the Gospel, enlightened me



with His gifts, sanctified and kept me in the true faith." This we have learned by studying the Small Catechism about the work of the Holy Spirit. And thus we pray when we sing the hymn "Come, Holy Ghost, Creator Blest" (*LSB 498*). "Come, Holy Ghost, Creator Blest, And make our hearts Your place to rest; Come with Your grace and heav'nly aid, And fill the hearts which You have made."

This prayer is not just a longing plea. It is a request that rests in the promise of Jesus: "But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you, and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the end of the earth" Acts 1:8 (ESV). Have you ever thought about your faith as power? Too often, we simply equate faith to an intellectual assent or a possession to hold for assurance of our own eternal well-being. Jesus says, however, that what the Holy Spirit gives you is power. As "with graces sevenfold" He adorns you, He works through His people, through His Church, to "proclaim to all the world [God's] holy name."

This is the joy and strength of the Lutheran Women's Missionary League. Even as the Iowa East District meets in local societies or in district events, you are part of that work - through prayer, through mites, through ingatherings, through action — you truly are a vessel through whom the Holy Spirit works to proclaim throughout the world the saving love and work of Jesus. As you gather around the Word, the Holy Spirit works to strengthen you in your faith in Jesus, but do not lose sight of how He also empowers you so that you "in [your] lives the truth confess." The work and love of Jesus is known not only through your words, but also through the actions to which the Holy Spirit moves you.

### Rev. McHone Memorial

"You know you are a Lutheran if ..." were the words that I remembered as I read my email on November 8 while on vacation that Rev. Randy McHone, LWML Iowa East District Senior Pastoral Counselor, was called to his heavenly home. I immediately thought this was impossible and I had read the email incorrectly. I had just seen him a few months prior at an East Central Iowa Corridor Dystonia Support Group meeting where he appeared fine and made no mention of any health issues. My thoughts then went to his wife, Nancy, his family, and to the LWML IED. How could God take him from us? I know I should not question God's reason for taking one of His own children home. Pastor McHone knew that "going home" meant he would have everlasting life with his Savior.

It was obvious that Pastor McHone was loved and respected, as hundreds of people who had been impacted by him and his earthly ministry filled Grace Evangelical Lutheran Church on November 13. He was wearing his clerical robes and lay in a simple pine box coffin. More than 30 LCMS pastors sat together during the service. After the service and the playing of taps, his grandchildren gathered around the coffin and carried it to the hearse.

Pastor McHone was elected to the LWML IED Executive Committee at the 2016 LWML IED Convention as the Junior Pastoral Counselor. He and Pastor David Lingard would take turns giving a portion of the Bible study during each LWML IED Board of Directors' meeting. You knew it was Pastor McHone's turn as he would start his Bible Study with guotes from the book "You Know You Are a Lutheran If ..." by Janet Letnes Martin and Suzann (Johnson) Nelson. Occasionally he would also get slightly sidetracked and talk about Operation Barnabas. He loved being a part of the LWML and serving as the Pastoral Counselor. He was remembered at the November LWML IED Board of Directors' meeting with the singing of one of his favorite hymns, "Christ Be My Leader" (LSB 861).

God's Blessings to those who loved Pastor McHone. He will be missed. "You know you are a Lutheran if ..."

## Updating Zone and Society Record Forms



Where has the year gone? Please remember to complete

your new Zone and Society Record Forms after your zone rally and society elections. The forms are available from your zone president as well as on the LWML IED website at http://lwml-ied.org/ societyresources/. These forms are very important in three ways: 1) they provide the LWML IED Board of Directors with your contact information so we can keep you updated; 2) they are used to count the number of LWML members and societies; and 3) they are used to order and bill your societies for the Quarterly magazines and Alive newsletters for 2019.

Between now and January 31, 2019 is the only time of the year a society can decrease their Quarterly subscription numbers for 2019. If your society decreases the Quarterly subscription numbers after January 31, your society will be billed the amount based on the subscription number that is on file prior to January 31. The request to change subscription numbers must be given to the LWML IED Vice President of Communication and not the LWML IED Financial Secretary. Only payments for society Quarterly and Alive subscriptions are sent to the LWML IED Financial Secretary. The LWML IED VP of Communication is responsible for sending the updated subscription numbers to the LWML office in the spring, which takes effect with the Summer Quarterly issue.

Please complete the forms and send them to your Zone President or to myself as soon as possible. If your election is not until spring, please confirm the Alive and Quarterly subscription numbers and provide any changes before January 31, 2019.


