# The report of the Head Teller of the Teller Committee.

This year due to the postponement of the 40<sup>th</sup> Biennial LWML IED Convention the elections that would have been conducted at the June convention were completed by US Postal Mail. The ballots for voting for officers, bylaws updates and mission grants were mailed to the 150 registered delegates with an enclosed stamped envelope with the mailing address and return address previously made out and attached. These ballots were addressed to me as the appointed Head Teller. There were 141 returned ballots received by the June 12<sup>th</sup> cutoff date. There were two ballots that were returned late—one was ten days past the cutoff date and one was six weeks past due. Both of these ballots were destroyed per the motion to destroy all ballots. On June 14<sup>th</sup> the teller committee comprising of members from several societies of the St. Ansgar Zone met to count the ballots received. There was one member from St. Peter, Elma; one from New Hope, Charles City; one from St. Peter's, Riceville; and one from Trinity, Osage plus myself.

The results of the of the election of officers were as follows: Vice President of Communications, Helen Huedepohl from the Williamsburg Zone; Vice President of Human Care, Angie Banko from the Mt. Pleasant Zone; Vice President of Organizational Resources, Carolyn Zimmerman of Cedar Rapids Zone; Treasurer. Rebecca Gluesing from the Clinton Zone; and Junior Pastoral Counselor, Rev. Christopher Roepke from the Mt. Pleasant Zone.

All proposed bylaws amendments were approved by a large majority. There were a few written comments regarding bylaws that I will pass on to the VP of Organizational Resources for her committee's consideration.

The delegates could vote for nine of the proposed mission grants. The teller committee recorded the number of votes each grant received and then ranked the grants from the one with the most votes to the one with the least votes. The 2020-2022 Biennial Mission Grant goal of \$105,000.00 will fund (or partially fund) 14 of the top ranked grants. A list of the approved mission grants is available on the district website.

The results of the elections were reported on a Zoom meeting of the BOD on June 16<sup>th</sup>. In my opinion this procedure worded quite well under the current circumstances. Betty Borchardt, Head Teller of Teller Committee
