Did you attend our National convention in Des Moines? If not, you missed a wonderful opportunity to see how our mites are helping through mission grants. Now that we



have our 2015-2017 biennium grants selected at the national level, it is time to look toward our District Mission Grants for 2016-2018. The October 1, 2015 deadline is quickly approaching. Go to our web site (www.lwml-ied.org), click on Mission Grants, and download the application.

Students were very busy this past spring with applications. We have the privilege of supporting nine young adults through our Student Aid Grants as they work toward their goal of full-time church work. Please take time to learn more about them on our web site or on Facebook.

Highlighted below are two more mission grant recipients who are reaping the bounty of God's love.

Mission Central, "Lutheran Church of the Philippines Church Planting" - \$10,000: The Church of the Philippines has established a goal to plant 100 new congregations and train hundreds of lay evangelists by 2017. Professional fees, government compliance and administrative costs for training and doing business in the Philippines are serious challenges to providing Christian care to the very poor who live in darkness. This grant helps overcome those obstacles to reach the people of the Philippines with the Gospel of Jesus Christ.

Lutherans For Life, "Word Of Hope Ministry" - \$5,000: Word of Hope recently merged with Lutherans For Life. Its mission is to bring the healing of Jesus Christ to men, women, and families whose hearts are broken by abortion.

Word of Hope's program provides Gospelfocused resources, a 24/7 telephone hotline that answers 300 calls a month, confidential counseling and support to those who have had an abortion in the past and counseling for those who are contemplating an abortion in the future. Word of Hope shares the Gospel to bring healing, hope, and forgiveness.

This issue of the Alive is filled with reports of the excitement of our convention in Des Moines and the many stories of what our mites have done and will be doing for missions. At the final session on Saturday a first-timer asked me, "What does the other \$500,000 do for missions? Why do we say we have a mission goal of two million dollars and then only designate part of it for mission grants?"

My quick answer was that all the work that LWML does is for the purpose of mission and service. But where does the money go? LWML does not have any dues, so all the costs of running the organization must come from our mites. The officers and board members at any level of the organization are not paid, but they are reimbursed for expenses of attending the meetings (although many of them donate their travel costs). There are paid staff at the national level for publishing, accounting, marketing and other services. Committees develop the resources available to all of us through the web site or the catalog, but converting them to all the materials available free to members and societies is done by LWML staff.

And what rich resources we have! One of my favorite parts of convention is visiting the LWML store to see what is new. The clothing, books, and gift items are nice to have, but the real treasures are in the many pamphlets and notebooks for how to improve our work at the society, zone, and district level. There is help for every officer and committee and most of it is free or at a very nominal cost. I am finding inspiration from the new book by our past national presidents, Hope Notes: Devotions for Women. I encourage each of you to use the resources of LWML.

May we all grow in our ability to "Serve the Lord with gladness."

St. John's Lutheran Ladies celebrate a century of service

St. John's Lutheran Ladies Aid of rural Victor enjoyed a momentous celebration of their 100th anniversary on Sunday, June 14, at their church south of Victor. The morning service began with the ladies singing "Our God, Our Help in Ages Past." Pastor Stuart Rethwisch recognized them for their volunteer dedication to the congregation and the world, by this auxiliary of the church.

As a part of the observance, all ladies were invited to wear hats, harking back to the traditions of years gone by. Also recalling tradition (up until about the recent half century), the women sat on the north side of the church, while all men sat on the south side. As a unique recollection of the past, the offering was gathered in klingle boidles, velvet bags attached to wooden poles, which were extended down the rows of parishioners by the ushers. The klingle boidles were purchased by the Ladies Aid in 1918.

Following the service, a short program included the reading of a brief history of the century of Ladies Aid activity. A bountiful dinner was provided and served by the Church Council.

A Meaningful History

On Jan. 18, 1915, twelve ladies met to organize a ladies group. At the next meeting, it was named "The St. John's Lutheran Ladies Aid Society." Meetings were to be held the second Thursday of each month, which continue to this day. The German language was used for the first three years, and after 1918 English has been used exclusively.

In 1918 the ladies began making and giving away quilts to area families who had fires and other disasters, and the practice has spread to donations around the world. There is no exact count of quilts that have been donated, but it is estimated to be approximately 3,000. This year, most of the record number of 60 quilts crafted by St. John's went to Lutheran World Relief, who collectively delivered 9,240 quilts to Nepal in the earthquake disaster.

In addition to supplying quilts, the Ladies Aid also made bandaging cloths for hospitals in World War II. They have sponsored students to become church workers, served many meals for funerals, farm sales and other events, and

provided new altar coverings and financial assistance to larger church projects, such as carpeting and a new roof. In November each year, boxes of baked goods are packed and given to shut-ins, those serving in the military, and college students.

Until February 1948, the ladies met in the members' homes, until the church building was raised, and the basement was built. Several times each year the meetings are held at area restaurants.

In 1947 the Ladies Aid joined the International Lutheran Women's Missionary League, which provided the women with a world-wide avenue of access to help with needs everywhere. Their motto is "Serve the Lord with Gladness." Through gathering of Mites for Missions, based on Jesus' parable of the widow's mite, nearly two million dollars has been put to work here and abroad, in the past biennium.

Through its century of existence, the St. John's Lutheran Ladies Aid has been dedicated to promote Christian knowledge, to develop a greater zeal for church work and missions, to perform works of charity – and for wonderful fellowship.
