Clergy Corner

Bountiful! Sow • Nourish • Reap

We know that Jesus was the son of a carpenter, and at that time in history it was typical for the son to follow the father's profession. It is likely that Jesus was taught the trade of carpentry by His father. But even if Jesus was a carpenter, He was surrounded by an agricultural society, just as we are here in Iowa. Jesus was familiar with agriculture and tended to use agricultural analogies in His teaching and preaching. One of Jesus' most striking agricultural analogies is as follows:

⁴ Abide in me, and I in you. As the branch cannot bear fruit by itself, unless it abides in the vine, neither can you, unless you abide in me. ⁵ I am the vine; you are the branches. Whoever abides in me and I in him, he it is that bears much fruit, for apart from me you can do nothing. ⁶ If anyone does not abide in me he is thrown away like a branch and withers; and the branches are gathered, thrown into the fire, and burned (John 15:4-6, ESV).

It is through hearing the Word of God that faith is sown in our hearts and minds through the Holy Spirit. If we are severed from the Word of God, we are no longer nourished in the Gospel of our Lord, but are subject to the teachings of the devil and our sinful world and they will work to pull us away from the Word of God and eternal life. Just as a branch, when broken from the vine is no longer able to receive the life giving nourishment from the vine, it withers and dies. When we are separated from God's Word, we are a severed branch, subject to the attacks of the devil and the sins of this world and our faith is weakened.



Chief of Sinners Though I Be (LSB 611)

Chief of sinners though I be, Jesus shed His blood for me, Died that I might live on high, Lives that I might never die. As the branch is to the vine, I am His, and He is mine.

Through Jesus, even the worst of sinners can be forgiven of their sins, just as St Paul's words are echoed in the hymn. Jesus died for all sinners and when He died and rose on the third day, he defeated death and the devil. Those who repent and believe have eternal life. Through the work of the LWML the seed, the Word of God, is sown in many locations so that those who hear the Gospel, the Holy Spirit will work faith in their hearts and minds. Just like when crops are planted, the work does not stop with this initial planting of the Word. People must continue to hear the Word of God so they are nourished by the vine, Jesus Christ. As their belief strengthens, they can then bear fruit by spreading the Gospel of Jesus Christ to those around them and throughout the world. The cycle then continues that through these people, more may come to faith through the Holy Spirit and through their belief in Jesus as their Savior, many will reap eternal life.

Worker Information and Special Dress

Check in at the Workers' Room #107 at least 15 minutes before your work shift begins. You will also need to check out at the end of each shift. There may be worker assignments that need to be filled. If you are willing to work additional hours, please check in at the Workers' Room whenever you are available.

Prior to your first shift you will need to go to the Workers' Room #107 to pick up your t-shirt, yellow scarf and badge. The Workers' Room will be open at 8 a.m. Wednesday. For those who work immediately after arrival, there is a large ladies room just across from the Workers' Room, where you may change. (It is suggested that those workers arrive in tan pants and another shirt, which they can then just roll up and put in their new convention tote bag.) Volunteers may want to pick up their shirts as soon as they register so the shirts can be hung up in their hotel room.

Those who have an early morning shift on Wednesday or Thursday (Golf Tourney, Transportation or Hotel Hostesses) where it will not work to come to the IEC before your shift, your shirts will be mailed to you. Otherwise, please do not make a request for the items to be sent to you.

FAQs: Convention

Q: Where can I obtain information about the convention?

A: Complete convention information and forms are available in the 2014 winter issue of the *Lutheran Woman's Quarterly and on the LWML website: www.lwml.org/conventions.*



Q: Where in Des Moines will the convention be held?

A: The convention venue site is the lowa Events Center (IEC) located at 730 Third Street, Des Moines, Iowa 50309.

Q: When does registration open?

A: Regular registration is open. Late registration is after 5/8/15.

Q: What is included in the registration fee?

A: The registration fee includes admission to all convention sessions, evening programs, and the exhibit hall.

Q: Does a person need to be registered to participate in the servant activity?

A: An individual may register and pay the \$10 fee for the servant activity without registering for the convention.

Q: Does a person need to be registered to participate in the mission pledge walk, purchase catered meals, sing in the choir, or register their child/youth?

A: Yes. Only those registered may participate.

Q: Do children need to be registered?

A: Yes. Children under the age of 18 must be registered on the form of a responsible adult. Those enrolled in the child/youth programs pay daily fees but not a registration fee.

Q: May guests attend the Friday evening Bountiful Bash, Saturday evening entertainment and Sunday morning worship?

A: Yes, guests may attend those events. They will be given a name tag and must complete an Acknowledgement/Release Form, both available on site. A donation to the mite goal would be appreciated for the Bountiful Bash. There will be a \$10 charge per person for the Saturday evening entertainment.

Q: Who may attend the Opening Worship Service on Thursday, June 25 at 7 p.m.?

A: The Opening Worship Service is open to the public and everyone is invited to attend. It will be held in the lowa Events Center, Exhibit Hall B&C of HyVee Hall. Music begins at 6:45 p.m.

Q: What if my hotel is not close to the IEC?

A: Shuttle busing will be provided for those housed in the outlying hotels in the LWML block of hotels. The daily parking fee at the IEC north parking lot is \$7 a day, with in and out privileges.

Q: When will convention tours information be available?

A: Tour information is available at lwml.org/conventions.
