Clergy Corner

The theme for this summer's LWML convention is "Bountiful! Sow • Nourish • Reap." This theme is perfect for a gathering in Iowa! When traveling into our state the signs that welcome you say, "Welcome to Iowa, Fields of Opportunities." This refers both to our national reputation for outstanding agricultural production and our worldwide reputation for superior educational and technological opportunities. I also believe it is a great way for all those coming to Iowa for our convention to remember the theme "Bountiful! Sow • Nourish • Reap.

Most of the Bible was originally written to those living in an agrarian society, people familiar with working the land, managing livestock, and raising crops. Many of Jesus' parables involve the farming life. Not surprisingly, then, the Bible contains many references to sowing and reaping, however, not much is said about plant nourishment. The closest reference is probably in I Corinthians 3:6 where Paul says, "I planted, Apollos watered, but God gave the growth."

Down at the soil level where crops grow, understanding plant nutrition is important. Plant scientists tell us that in order for a plant to grow, the nutrients must be in a form the plant can use. God in His grace gives us the nutrition we need. He gives us Jesus! Jesus comes to us in His Word and Sacraments. It is through these means of grace that He offers and gives us the forgiveness of sins, life and salvation. Martin Luther reminds us of the nourishment we receive from Christ:

O Lord, we praise Thee, bless Thee, and adore Thee, In thanksgiving bow before Thee. Thou with Thy body and Thy blood didst nourish



Our weak souls that they may flourish:

O Lord, have mercy! (TLH 313)

Farmers inform us that for there to be a bountiful harvest, nutrients must be present in a usable form at the time the plants can make best use of them. This is where God uses us. There are people who are spiritually dying because they need the nourishment only Christ can give. Who are these people? Some are certainly those who live in lands far away with unfamiliar cultures. But there are others nearby. They are members of our families, they are our co-workers, and they are our neighbors. Their need is our opportunity to tell them about Jesus. The Holy Spirit works through people like you and me to share the good news of the love God has for us in Jesus Christ.

Yes, God opens for us "Fields of Opportunities." The greatest blessing we receive from God is the forgiveness of sin and the promise of everlasting life. When we share that Good News (the nourishment of Christ) with others, something amazing happens. We are actually delivering what our neighbor needs most and what Jesus freely gives, the forgiveness of sin. Martin Luther concludes his hymn:

May Thy body, Lord, born of Mary, That our sins and sorrows did carry, And Thy blood for us plead In all trial, fear, and need: O Lord, have mercy!

Our goal at Convention is 100 gallons. If you have given whole blood within 8 weeks or double red cell within 16 weeks, you will not be eligible to give blood at the Convention.

The Committee also took district photo orders at convention. The committee was able to meet most of the 8,000 in attendance. Now we can see all of those hundreds of pictures immediately on Facebook.

The Transportation Committee had the task of transporting many from the Des Moines airport to the Iowa State University campus in Ames. Each person had their information on a 3x5 card and spread out on a table. Excel sure can make that a much simpler task of making the arrangements. And who doesn't have a GPS to direct them to the Iowa Events Center?

So many other changes in these past 30 years. But some things haven't changed. LWML is still communicating the Good News through our mites and our mission projects. To God be the Glory!

Young Women are Needed as Pages

The Personnel Resources Department is busy assigning volunteers to work at Convention. One area still in need of workers is that of Pages. We would like to have a dozen. We need your help in recruiting more Pages!

- Pages are to be between 14-17 years of age.
- There is NO REGISTRATION fee for Pages. They should be listed on an adult's registration form, Line 6 Children under 18.
- Any teenager who is staying overnight during the convention MUST be housed with an adult, be that a parent, other relative or friend (they may be asked to help pay for their lodging, but that is up to the adults with whom they are rooming). Pages living in the Des Moines area may wish to commute to convention, staying at home overnight.
- Pages may choose not to attend the entire convention, and should indicate any preference of days for working on a CALL FOR WORKERS form.
- Pages will be given a t-shirt, hat and badge to complete their Page Special Dress. The order form for the t-shirt will come in their worker packet, when assignments are made. If a Page wants more than one t-shirt they will incur that expense.
- Pages will pay for their own meals.
- It is hoped that each Page will be able to work two, 4-hour shifts. This may be adjusted to best fit the number of Pages available.

Page Duties

Pages will deliver messages, run errands and assist in other areas as needed. They will serve in the delegate area and have assigned seating. Messages will be delivered at the request of delegates or VIP guests. Some pages may be assigned to assist one particular officer or committee chairman. Pages can feel free to participate in singing, Bible studies, etc. while remaining on the lookout for messages.
