that convention; no cell phones or email capability, only dependence on land lines, fax and the US Postal Service.

Certainly we've come a long way. No doubt a good many of the women who were the hosts or the guests at that convention will not be with us next year, and more than likely very few of us will be here to be hosts again in another 30 years. However, June 2015 is only a few short months away, and our focus turns to the thrilling opportunity and the privilege for the LWML ladies of Iowa East and Iowa West to be hosts for the national convention, this time in Des Moines.

The convention theme has been announced "Bountiful! Sow · Nourish · Reap" — a very fitting convention theme for the heartland of America, where we recognize how bountifully God shares His love and goodness and how He equips us by the Holy Spirit to be in our Father's harvest field. Dear friends in Christ,

Several years ago I planted an apple tree in our back yard. I planted is *not an apple* it with the anticipation that one day it would produce for me and my family a bountiful harvest. I knew it was a young tree so I had no expectations about it producing apples right away. It has, over the years, grown into a beautiful tree. A couple And these fruits, or characteristics, of years ago it finally produced a few buds. I was certain that summer was going to be the summer I would be eating delicious sweet apples right off the tree I had planted. But, there was a late frost that spring and as a result there were no apples. The following year there were no buds and therefore no fruit.

The real problem was that, at the time, I had two neighbors, one to the east and one to the west, who have beautiful apple trees that produce an abundance of apples. My neighbor to the east thought the reason there were no apples was my fault. He told me I needed to trim the tree, and if I did it would produce apples. I have a great deal of respect for my neighbor so I did as he told me. In fact, I invited him over to inspect my tree trimming. He thought I had done a good job and we both expected a harvest of apples in the fall. Again, nothing!

Jesus said that Christians are recognizable by their fruit. (Matthew 7:16-20). The tree in my back yard

is a beautiful tree but so far it tree (no fruit!). Christians are



more than just beautiful people we are fruit trees! The fruit of the Christian is God-given character that is seen and experienced by others. are described by the apostle Paul as being love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control (Galatians 5:22,23). This means our Bountiful convention is nothing but a basket of beautiful fruit!

In John 15:8 Jesus explains that for believers the secret of being fruitful (of a Bountiful harvest) is abiding in Him, for bearing spiritual fruit is only possible through the power of God. 30 Years Ago ...

From WINGS by Marly Taege about the LWML Convention in Ames, Iowa, July 22-25, 1985.

The largest number ever to register at a convention in the history of the LWML was in Ames with 8,023 leaguers and guests. Location, campus setting (\$47 per day for room and meals) and attendance of 3,000 leaguers from Iowa alone were some reasons cited for the record attendance numbers



Firsts from Ames:

- The first devotional book published by the League, "You Are Special" by Alma Kern.
- Opening festival service featured a 780-voice choir, more than 10,000 worshippers, and a hymn, "In Glory Resplendent, in Honor and Might" by Prof. Henry I. Letterman.
- An elegant wooden holder for the convention candle was handcrafted by Ross Barnes, husband of Alberta, LWML President.
- Offerings totaling a new high of \$70,194 provided \$23,334 toward the mission goal, \$18,833 for African hunger, \$14,382 to purchase a van to transport children to Hispanic religious classes in Washington, and \$13,644 for Native American Indian ministry.
- Bylaws changed to add a fourth vice -president and rename the vicepresidential positions, making them all equal.
- Each district chose a different mission need and brought samples forward in a dedication of ingathering items.
- Delegates adopted a new mission goal of \$845,520.
