

Grief is a season of life that we all pass through. Everyone has or will have a loved one that will die. I am currently in the season of grieving the death of my father. This is a time in my life when I have been so thankful for my faith and have clung to Christ as my stronghold and strength. I cannot



imagine how those with no faith get through this time in their life.

Some struggle with knowing what to say and do when their friend or acquaintance is grieving. These are some things that have helped me. Send a card with a note that you are praying for them. If you have a story to share about the person who died, include that in the card. Those stories will bring a smile to the family. If the person is comfortable with it, give them a hug. One thing the last year has shown us is that the human touch is important and comforting. Give a specific offer of help to the family. Can you bring dinner? Mow grass? Shovel snow? Pick up groceries? Shuttle kids or grandkids to school or activities? Don't just say call if you need something because chances are they won't call, but the specific offer may be just what they need.

It is easy to do these things in the immediate aftermath of a death, but don't forget to keep doing them in the weeks and months later. Grief has no timeline and the prayers and caring of friends will continue to be needed.
