V.P. GOSPEL OUTREACH: - I prepared the Mission Grant video for the convention and the delegates voted to fund \$111,096 in Mission Grants. The scholarship committee will be meeting just before or just after the board meeting.

V.P. HUMAN CARE: - The women of the Marshalltown zone have requested donations of men's and women's socks for the Marshalltown Veteran's home. Thank you notes have been received from Gifts from the Heart recipients from the district convention. An article was written for the ALIVE.

LWML - Iowa East District financials as of June 30, 2022 are summarized below. The full financial report and the 2020-2022 Biennium Financial Report are available in the password-protected section of the LWML IED website.

The proposed mission grant budget was originally \$100,000 but since we funded \$11,596 in mission grants in the first quarter of the current biennium that total was added to the mission grant budget. The grants funded were \$3,000 to LCMS Mission Worker Wellness and \$8,596 to Voice of Care. Also approved at the District Convention was an increase of \$1,094 to fully fund the final mission grant. This brings the new total to \$112,690. A second change approved at the District Convention was to pull student scholarships out of mission grants into their own category that will be a priority in funding. If you've been able to keep track of all the changes, it means that the 2022-2024 budget will include \$30,000 in student scholarships and \$82,690 in mission grants. Making student scholarships an independent line item indicates the high priority LWML IED places on our student outreach.

Current financials stand as follows:

Balance on hand as of 03/31/2022 \$ 9,003.25 Income received since 04/01/2022+ \$ 27,486.87 Less expenses since 04/01/2022- \$ 29,517.06 Balance on hand as of 06/30/2022 = \$ 6,973.06

The LWML IED Student Aid Endowment Fund balance at the LCMS Foundation stood at \$100,141.51 as of 06/30/2022 (most recent statement). This is a decrease of \$11,356.38 from the 12/31/2022 balance resulting from a change in market value. The stock market has not been kind to any investor.

The LWML IED Joyful Response Steward Account balance at the Lutheran Church Extension Fund stood at \$1,312.14 as of 06/30/2022 (most recent statement). \$1,066 (this is the amount available at the end of the biennium) has been transferred to the checking account and will be used to help fund our scholarship grant commitments.

MINUTES OF THE IOWA EAST DISTRICT LUTHERAN WOMEN'S MISSIONARY LEAGUE 41<sup>ST</sup> BIENNIAL CONVENTION June 10-11, 2022

**Banner Processional and Opening Worship** – Liturgists were Rev. Michael Knox and Rev. Kevin Richter. Rev. Dr. Brian Saunders gave the sermon on anchors in the Bible, anchors in our life. The offering was for the Iowa East District 2022-2024 Mite Goal.

**Session 1 Friday Afternoon** 

President Margaret Kistler called the 41<sup>st</sup> Biennial Convention of the Lutheran Women's Missionary League (LWML) Iowa East District (IED) to order at 2:00 pm. The Pledge of Allegiance and the Pledge to the Cross were recited by all. The Waterloo Zone Convention Co-captains gave a welcome with the Williamsburg and Westgate Zone responding. Greetings from the LCMS Iowa District East President and Lutheran Church Extension Fund were received. President Kistler gave acknowledgements and introduced special guests. The LWML Pledge was led by the past LWML IED presidents.

Lora Duncan gave the credentials report. As of 1:00 pm on June 10, 2022, a quorum was present with all 12 zones of the Iowa East District represented. Out of a possible 180 delegates there were 67 voting delegates, 4 voting past presidents, and 20 voting board members for a total of 91 eligible to vote. There were 13 non-voting board members and 73 other registrants for a total attendance of 177. Lora Duncan moved that the roll given be the official roll of the voting assembly of the convention. Motion seconded and carried.

Carolyn Zimmerman moved to adopt the convention agenda as printed in the convention manual. Seconded and carried.

Cheryl Killham moved to adopt the convention rules as printed in the convention manual. Seconded and carried.

President Kistler gave the appointment of convention tellers.

Marna Mohr presented the 2020-2022 Financial Secretary's Report as printed in the convention manual.

Becky Gluesing presented the 2020-2022 Treasurer's Report and review as printed in the convention manual. Becky moved to accept the review as printed. Seconded and carried. Becky presented the 2022-2024 Mite Budget as printed in the convention manual and approved by the Board of Directors. Total of \$152,400 with \$138,500 for outreach, including \$30,000 for scholarships and \$70,000 for mission grants and \$13,900 for inreach. Becky gave a reminder that part of the 2022-2024 mission grant budget would need to be used to finish paying for the 2020-2022 mission grants as there was a shortfall in the mites received for 2020-2022. Jeanette Kreutner moved to increase the mission grant budget to \$80,000. Seconded and carried. The amended budget motion was then seconded and carried.

Jeanette Kreutner gave the 2022-2024 Proposed Mission Grants Presentation. There was a prayer before voting. Voting members voted on mission grants. Dennis Pieper from Voices of Care gave a Mites in Action report.

Judy Westergren gave the nominating committee report and introduced the candidates. There was a prayer before voting. Voting members voted on election of officers.

President Kistler declared Session I closed.

Dr. Cari Chittick was the speaker at the evening banquet.

### **Session II Saturday morning**

The Young Women Representative presented the opening devotions.

Offering was collected for LCMS Disaster Relief

Lora Duncan gave the report that there was an error in the credentials given in Session I. The corrected credentials were 70 voting delegates, 4 voting past presidents, and 20 voting board members for a total of 94 eligible to vote. There were 12 non-voting board members and 66

other registrants for a total registration of 172. Lora moved to accept the corrected credential reports. Seconded and carried.

The LWML Mission Statement was read.

Carol von Soosten gave a report from Gifts of Love.

Rev. Chris Roepke led the first Bible study.

The results of the Mission Grant voting were given.

Judith Fink gave a presentation on the 80<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the LWML.

The exhibitors were introduced and gave greetings.

President Kistler declared Session II closed.
