OPENING WORSHIP: Pastor Vesey

CALL TO ORDER: President Martha Hartwig called the meeting to order at 9:15 a.m. in the name of the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.

MINUTES OF PREVIOUS MEETING: Minutes of the previous meeting had been posted on the LWML-IED website for review. Hearing no additions or corrections the minutes stand approved as posted. Pres. Hartwig appointed Ginny Boyer and Nancy McHone for minutes review.

TREASURER: Report stands as submitted.

FINANCIAL SECRETARY: Report stands as submitted. Jennifer Determan moved on recommendation from the EC that the \$250 gift to the district from LWML in August 2024 be used as a gift split between 2 first time convention attendees to help with costs. No second was needed and the motion was approved. An application will be provided online and in the ALIVE for women to submit for consideration.

VP OF COMMUNICATION: Reports stand as submitted. Registrar Betty Borchardt reported that there will be a .50 increase in the coming year for each Quarterly subscription. ALIVE editor Annette Raebel reminded members of the Feb. 10 deadline for the next ALIVE. Pres. Hartwig moved to appoint Kim Davis to the Communications committee as assistant webmaster - motion seconded and approved.

VP OF GOSPEL OUTREACH: Report stands as submitted. VP Jeanette Kreutner reported the Belize Mission trip will be next in line for funding.

Karen Boehme reported on the 3 women applying to be a YWR at the Omaha convention - biographies are in her submitted report. Kay Berry moved for IED to accept all three women - Mary Dubke, Anna Davis, and Audrey Armbrecht as YWR's to Omaha with IED paying for their registration, meal package, housing, and transportation. - Delegates will only vote on a grant goal instead of a total expense goal.
